Patriot Program Requirements for Third Grade


1. <u>Practice at home. Complete in school.</u> What is the county seat of Harford County?

2. <u>Practice at home. Complete in school</u>. Who is the current County Executive of Harford County?

3. <u>Practice at home. Complete in school</u>. Locate Harford County on a map of Maryland.



4. <u>Complete at home.</u> Color the attached Harford County Seal with the appropriate colors (yellow can be used in place of gold if needed). Write your first and last name on your sheet in the way you would like it to be written on your certificate of program completion.

5. <u>Complete at home</u>. Make a poster (an 8.5"x11" piece of paper may be used) of someone you believe is an American Patriot. Include a picture (photo or drawing), their name, birth and death dates (if applicable) and three facts supporting why you feel they are an American Patriot.

6. <u>Completed at home.</u> Complete 1 hour of community service. This can be an activity of your choice, just make sure to discuss your plan with a grown-up first. Some ideas for community service include:

- Collect food, toys, clothes, books, towels, blankets, or other items and donate them to an organization in need.
- Rake leaves or shovel snow for a neighbor or family member.
- Pick up trash in your neighborhood or other area.
- Make Holiday cards or decorations and donate to a senior living facility.
- Write letters to of gratitude to servicemen and women. (Be sure not to include personal information other than your first name.)
- Bring a treat to the local sheriff's office or firehouse to show gratitude.

After you have completed your community service, fill out the community service form included in this packet and have an adult sign it. You may turn this in to your Patriot Program volunteer.
